J. Bennett proposed and G. Schofield seconded that the minutes of the previous meeting be accepted. This was passed unanimously.

Matters arising from the previous meeting's minutes.

The 'traffic light' system will be used to prioritise items for discussion.

The Tourism Group has folded so 5 items have been re-assigned to other Groups. 3 items have been re-assigned to this Group.

Loggans Mill.

Montgomery Properties own the Mill with a patch of land access from a leat at Loggans Road. It was stated that Montgomery Properties have experience with these buildings and are in contact with Penwith D.C. **GREEN** Project.

G.S. expressed concern with what Lidl's have done to an old bridge and said that Lidl's had been stopped from re-directing a leat.

A hotel may be built on marsh at the entrance to Hayle so we must keep an eye on planning.

H.A.P. management team will get briefings on plans for this project. Nothing will be approved before coming through this Group. **GREEN.**

It was agreed to assign this **RED** status.

Copperhouse Dock

It was stated that the Co-op own both sides (by Daniel's Shop) It was agreed that we should try to get the foot bridge moved and get permission to build a new one using the

lock gate as part of the bridge. (Town Trust meeting. Dave Clark). English Heritage, The Town Trust to give support to C.C. for funding to move the footpath. This could be part of a Copperhouse project in a Heritage issue. The dock is to be rejuvenated as a project to restore and keep. It was suggested that Dave Clark should attend one of our meetings.

It was stated that the Co-op own the lock gates and give grants for projects. Should we focus on a clean-up to the back of Daniel's shop?

It was stated that a Residents Association exists to fight development to land along the Pool.

Copperhouse cinema

This is owned by Mr Nichols. Negotiations are ongoing to muse the upstairs for music and the downstairs for shops. Time is running out for a decision. It was agreed that the shops are an eyesore and that there is asbestos present in the building.

It was agreed that Copperhouse has not had the same attention as Foundry end of Hayle.

The market square house could be included with the cinema project.

Project 22

This deals with the Towans. It was suggested that the Chairman should attend the Town Partnership meetings. J.B. said that the C.C. were carrying out a survey to find out the degree of erosion due to usage. The Police have been asked to supply data on parking, dumping etc.

What do the Towans mean to local people? The beach is owned by ING, National Trust, the Council and some private owners. Access is important and there should be toilets built. The Towans are a strong part of Hayle but lack facilities. The Chairman is to attend the meeting with these minutes for the Town Partnership.

It was agreed that Project 22 should go to the top of the agenda for the next meeting.

We are to contact the Co-op to see how we stand on some issues.

Project 22 to merge with Project 23.

Project 20. We are to press for protection of the coastline including Copperhouse Pool. No housing is to be built as it must be kept for leisure.

The Quay is a good example of heritage. The Lelant side of the Estuary was discussed.

Project 26. GS. and JB suggested that the regatta should be reinstated.
