He stated that we had to make a ‘strategic’ argument and he will provide details of what that must contain – to be discussed at the next meeting. Peter Moore CCC has agreed to attend this meeting to answer questions and talk about Tolroy from the County’s point of view.

Business and Enterprise.

David Clough is due to attend this meeting to discuss future planning issues and Claire Williams to discuss her plan for an ‘Adventure Activity Park’ at Upton Towans..

Heritage Environment and Culture.

They had a good meeting with David Scott to talk about possible so-ordination of events etc in the Hayle area. Certainly this may signal some co-operation between the groups.

Community Wellbeing.

Next Meeting - Tuesday 18th September. Day Care Centre . 7.30

This will focus on Youth Provision – We have the Hayle Youth Project and the County Youth Service. Both have attended previous meetings but not at the same time! There seems to be a lack of joined up thinking or a close relationship with local schools. We hope that at this meeting all parties will address this issue and investigate ways to involve young people in the HAPP process.

The Steering group will meet on the 26th September by which time all paper work, documents, applications for charitable status will be in place and final resolutions can be minuted to send off the application.

Simon Swale of the MCTA has recently written to a colleague citing Hayle as success. He wrote –“There is probably more community engagement in that town since they have published their community plan than anywhere else I know of. There are lots of innovative projects developing and there is an increased sense of identity in a place that has struggled for many years since its industrial heyday”

It has also been suggested that we should try to meet with someone from the Government Office South West – Jane Caro has been suggested by Alan Berry – I would welcome any opinions of this from the Team.
