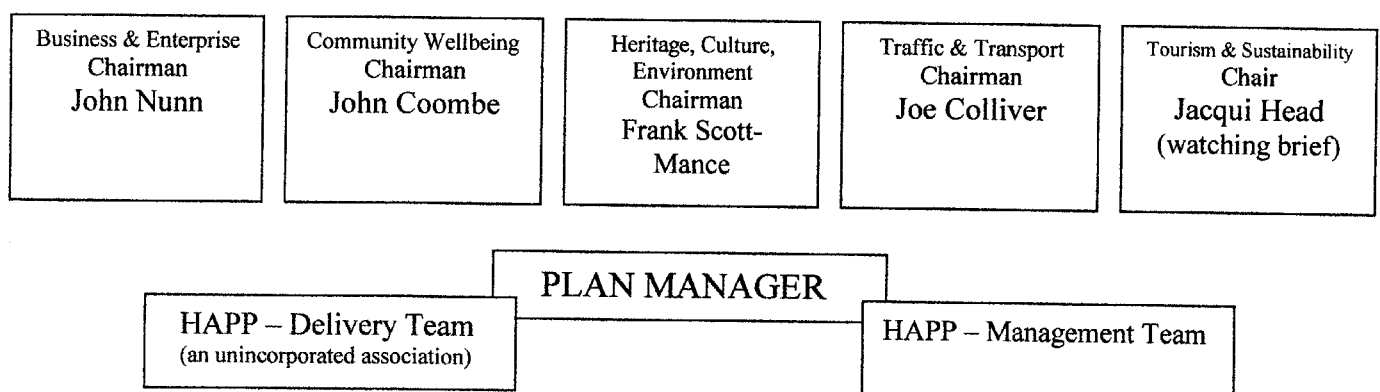

The Hayle Area Plan Partnership has achieved another huge step forward with the proposal of PDC to allocate £91,000 for the provision of a Plan Manager. This will cover the salary and administration costs for two years and we believe will provide a valuable boost to the progress that the plan has made in the last 6 months. We hope to have a manager in place at the beginning of 2008.

This now completes the structure as proposed in the Hayle Area Plan. The Delivery Groups have been very successful, the Management Team has grown to encompass the Parishes of St Erth and Gwithian/Gwinear, and PDC officers are ensuring that the Delivery Groups are involved in all the future planning for the area.

The other development is that the Steering Group which has guided the whole MCTi process for the last 5 years has now disbanded and will be superseded by the **Hayle Area Plan Partnership Delivery Team**. This will enable the Chairs of the Delivery Groups to come together to cross reference the developments within each group and will have charitable status to enable it to apply for funding for projects if all other avenues fail. The first meeting of this new group is scheduled for 14th November at 7.30 in the Passmore Edwards Institute. To provide continuity we feel it would be useful to have a representative of each of the three parish/town councils. This group will mostly be an information sharing facility and details of developments driven by the councils will be an important element of the whole picture. If you could arrange for a representative to be chosen we would be grateful. More detailed 'terms of reference' will be discussed at the inaugural meeting. Tovey as Community Agent, spearheaded the production of the Plan and administrative support has been provided throughout by Roger Winterburn. Roger is now leaving and we will be advertising a new post to provide administrative support for the Plan Manager post.

Many many people have contributed to the progress of the partnership so far, the challenge now is to deliver! Hayle and District are the first to create this kind partnership of community, councillors and officers and I am sure the addition of the Plan Manager can only help to achieve success.
