1. Apologies for Absence Cllr Jacqui Head

2 Minutes of the previous meeting. Were approved with the alteration to "any other business" that each County Councillor has £3000 to distribute in the community and not District Councillor as stated

3. Matters Arising. The Chairman had received a letter from Andrew George MP congratulating the group on successfully obtaining a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund to administer the Oral History Project. The grant is to fund the project for 2 years and we will need to advertise for a coordinator to manage the project. Laura Christon will attempt to find volunteers to help

4. Plan Managers Report

Jane has been concerned with determining forward planning. The Management meeting looked at subjects such as the Town Trail and Copperhouse Dock Martin Nixon is helping with the town trail and will produce some suitable leaflets.

Jane produced examples of the flags and banners which are to be placed at strategic points in the town. John Nunn was congratulated for his efforts to promote this project. A press release is to be organised.

Martin Nixon has indicated what is needed for the website.

Jane had attended the Cornwall Towns Association AGM. This was originally a group of all the Chairs of the MCTi but now was looking to expand its coverage. This had in the past mainly involved groups from north and east Cornwall

5. Treasurers Report Jim Wright reported that our current account stood at £12648.99 with no major items of expenditure outstanding.

SMALL GRANTS (All these applications were approved with the relevant conditions indicated)

- a) Hayle Netball Club applied for grant of £1000 for new equipment to enable recruitment of new members senior and junior They have no indoor facility in Hayle. They have funds of £500. Approved subject to proof of funding
- b) Hayle Rowing and Pilot Gig club have applied for a grant of £1000 to help towards purchase of a new training boat They have funds of £500 and are hoping for a grant of £8500 from Awards for All Approved subject to securing grant from Awards for All

- c) Hayle Runners applied for £1000 to help provide kit and training for young members, Check if beneficiaries are Hayle residents .Is the group working with others. We need evidence of match funding. Conditional approved
 - d) Hayle Rotary have applied for £500 to purchase blood pressure monitors for nurses sessions in the community. Approved subjects to receipt of invoices
 - e) St Erth Residents Association Applied for grant of £1000 towards a feasibility study for sustainable energy. Need written evidence of match funding (not received) written endorsement received from Parish Council .A planning assessment needed. Approved subject to proof of match funding
- John Nunn suggested we mark our contributions with some form of badge or sticker to let the public know of our input. This was well received.
- John Coombe added that Table Tennis for Fun and Surf life savers were hoping for follow up publicity by us
